<i>almonds</i>	
Almond – All In One	Self-fertile - February. Sweet flavoured with a soft shell.
Monovale	Hard shell nuts with good flavour. Good pollinator.
Almond – Self Fertile	Large soft shell. Prolific cropping.
<i>APPLES</i>	
Braeburn	Late Season. This apple is crisp, sweet and has very good flavour.
Cox's Orange	February. Sharp, tangy and medium sized.
Divine	Late summer picking. Is mildly sweet flavoured with moderate acidity and light cottony crisp flesh.
Fuji	Mid-March. Sweet and crisp. Long storage.
Golden Delicious	March / April. Sweet Juicy crisp flesh.
Granny Smith	Late season. Large crisp with exceptional white flesh. Distinctive flavour.
Liberty	Attractive red blushed apples with crisp, juicy flesh and a well-balanced sweet-tart flavour.
Monty's Surprise	April. Crisp, white juicy flesh. Excellent flavour.
Pacific Rose	Mid-season. Firm, crispy and juicy with a rich sweet taste.
Peasgood Nonsuch	Mid-Season. Crisp white flesh. Suitable dessert and cooking.
Red Delicious	March. Crisp white skin flesh, cooking and dessert.
Royal Gala	February. Sweet and juicy.
Splendor	March / April. Very Sweet.

<i>APPLES</i>	<i>BALLERINA</i>
Bolero	Mid-season. Attractive white tinged pink spring blossom followed by shiny green eating apples.
Polka	Mid-season. Medium sized fruit with green skin with a red blush. The flesh is crisp, juicy and has good flavour.
Waltz	Mid-season. Crisp and juicy with a slight tang. Suitable for eating and cooking.
<i>APRICOTS</i>	
Cluthagold	Self-fertile. Large oval fruit, with good eating quality.
Fitzroy	February. Self-fertile. Medium size golden fruit.
Garden Annie	Semi dwarf apricot. Pyramid-round shape. 2-3m.
Katy Cot	Self-fertile. A large all-purpose flavourful freestone apricot.
Royal Rosa	Early. Self-fertile. Medium size orange fruit with hint of red blush. Flavour increases with maturity.
Moorpark	Self-fertile. Fruit has superb flavour, is soft, juicy and large size. Suitable for eating and bottling.
Sundrop	Self-fertile but does crop better when pollinated with Trevatt. Large orange fruit. Sweet and juicy.
Royal Rosa	Self-fertile. Early. Freestone selection with tasty firm gold flesh.
Trevatt	Mid-January. Self-fertile. Golden yellow flesh skin. Dessert and bottling.
<i>APRICOTS</i>	<i>DWARF STANDARDS</i>
Aprigold	Self-fertile. Bears full size, early season highly coloured, and tangy flavoursome fruit.
<i>BLACKBERRIES</i>	

Black Satin	February. An early ripening thornless variety. Non-suckering canes. Unique sweet / tart flavour.
Navaho	December. Thornless with superior fruit quality.
<i>BLUEBERRIES</i>	
	At least two of the same variety should be planted together to ensure cross pollination. Fruit between January and April.
Centurion (Rabbiteye)	Later maturing. An excellent variety with heavy crops of small-medium sized berries.
Climax (Rabbiteye)	Early season. Medium to large dark blue berries with a very good flavour.
Delite (Rabbiteye)	Late season. The fruits are small and light blue with excellent flavour.
Powder Blue	Mid-late season. Excellent quality sweet dark blue fruit.
Tifblue (Rabbiteye)	Mid-late ripening. Tall vigorous upright grower. Large, highly flavoured berries.
Blue Crop (Northern Highbush)	Mid-season. Produces a heavy crop of excellent flavoured berries. Great for colder areas.
Blue Joy (Northern Highbush)	A good home garden selection. Compact habit, large tasty fruit which ripen over a prolonged period.
Brigitta (Northern Highbush)	Large, light blue fruits on sturdy upright branches. Ideal for eating and freezing.
Nui (Northern Highbush)	Mainstay NZ commercial now available to home gardeners. Super-sized light blue fruits with great taste.
<i>BOYSENBERRIS</i>	
Brulee	December / January. White flowers in early spring are followed by large firm dark purple black berries.
<i>CHERRY</i>	
Compact Stella	Self-fertile – Around Christmas. Good home variety. Dark red skin.

Lapins	Self-fertile – From early January. Large dark red firm with a good flavour.
DUAL – Lapins / Dawson	Dawson – Mid season. Dark black colour skin with red flesh. Lappins – Refer above.
<i>CHESTNUT</i>	
No 1005	Early March. Medium to large sweet nuts.
<i>Citrus</i>	
Grapefruit – Golden Special	NZ Grapefruit. Will ripen in cooler areas. An excellent breakfast fruit with just enough acidity.
Lemonade	This lemon look alike has sweet juicy fruit with no bitterness and taste like lemonade.
Lemon - Meyer	Hugely popular variety as the most cold hardy lemon variety. Large juicy smooth-skinned fruit. Once established will fruit all year round.
Lime - Bearss	A heavier bearing selection of Tahitian Lime well suited to cooler climates. Seedless, juicy fruit ideal for drinks or cooking.
Lime - Kaffir	A popular culinary citrus whose aromatic leaves are used extensively in Asian cooking.
Mandarin - Silverhill	A compact easy peel mandarin. Sweet juicy fruit ripening later in winter. Seedless unless cross pollinated. Ideal for container growing.
Tangelo - Seminole	This mandarin-grapefruit cross produces great crops of juicy, semi-flat, reddish orange fruit. Superb flavour.
<i>CRANBERRIES</i>	
Chilean Guava (Myrtus Ugni)	Bushy plant with delicate pink bell shaped flowers that produce small scrumptious, highly scented wine coloured berries. Ideal for hedging plant.

<i>CURRENTS</i>	
Black (Cotswold)	Large black fruit. Very tasty.
White	Excellent cropping variety with delicious white fruit.
Red	Small shining red berries ideal for jam or eating fresh.
Gloria De Versailles	December / January. Red berries.
Magnus	December / January. Black berries.
<i>FEIJOA'S</i>	
Apollo	Self-fertile but does best with cross pollination - April. Large, long sweet tasting fruit with excellent flavour.
Unique	Self-fertile - April / May. Large sweet juicy fruit produced on small tree.
<i>figs</i>	
Brown Turkey	March / April. Light amber flesh, green skin. Good for drying and jam.
Sweet Black	March / April. Dark skin, pink flesh and creamy texture. So sweet, eat it skin and all.
<i>gooseberry</i>	
Invicta	Christmas time. Can be eaten raw or cooked.
Pax	Christmas time. Red when ripe and mostly thornless.
<i>grapes</i>	
Albany Surprise	March. Large mild Lubrusca flavour. Jet black skin.
Iona	Mid-season. Sweet, green with purplish tinge.
Niagara	Early season. Very sweet white grape with thin skin and low seed content.
Robinson	Fruits twice. Sweet, black Humburg type.
Schulyer	February. Good flavour. Jet black medium size bunches.

Steuben	A reddish-black grape that produces long, tapering compact clusters. Sweet with a distinctive spicy tang.
<i>Hazelnut's</i>	
Merveille de Bolwillier	Mainly used as a pollinator. Produces a few large nuts.
Whiteheart	March. Smaller nuts, suitable processing. High crackout.
<i>loganberry</i>	
Waimate	Self-fertile. This delicious and healthy berry has resulted from breeding between raspberries and blackberries. Thornless vine.
<i>NECTARINES</i>	
Early Red 2	Early. Yellow flesh and red blushed skin. Good balance of sweet and tart. Good eating.
Fantasia	Late. Excellent yellow fleshed producing large fruit. Very good flavour.
Goldmine	One of the best flavoured nectarines. Fruit is a medium size with white flesh.
Red Gold	Late January. Dark red over gold yellow skin. Freestone. Sweet and juicy.
Snow Queen	Early. Sweet and juicy. Creamy white firm flesh with dark red skin. Large and freestone.
<i>NECTARINES</i>	<i>Dwarf standards</i>
Flavour Zee	Mid-season. Yellow fleshed fruit of good size.
Garden Delight	Large single pale pink flower. Nice eating.
Nectar Babe	Bright red fruit, flavourful, sweet and juicy. Freestone flesh.

<i>OLIVES</i>	
Arbequina	A genuinely smaller tree with good oil properties and high oil content.
Frantoio	An evergreen tree, the olives are suitable for oil or table.
Leccino	A fruiting evergreen tree. A superb Tuscan oil variety, vigorous growing and especially cold tolerant once established. Pollinator – Frantoio
<i>PASSIONFRUIT</i>	
Black	Late summer. Large black fruit with a sweet pulp that surrounds numerous black seeds. Best in a sunny frost free site protected from cold wind.
<i>PEACHES</i>	
April White	Late season. A delicious white firm fleshed large peach.
Black Boy	Dark furry fruit with rich purplish red veined fruit. Very flavoursome.
Elegant Lady	January. Firm freestone flesh is just the right balance of sugar and acid and coloured a warm yellow.
Flamecrest	January. Good fruit size with excellent texture and flavour.
Golden Queen	Late season. A true favourite for bottling and an excellent eater. Firm deep orange flesh and deep yellow-orange skin.
Gordons Glory	March. Clingstone peach with similar flesh and flavour to Golden Queen.
Healeys Peacharine	Late season. Nectarine / Peach cross. Excellent eating and great bottler.
Peachcot	A fine dessert fruit crossed between peach and apricot.
Redhaven	Mid-season. Firm, yellow fleshed medium to large fruit. Excellent flavour.
Wiggins	Early Season. Heritage variety. White juicy flesh with superb flavour.

Yumyeong	Late season. All the way from Korea. Very delicious, large white crunchy-fleshed peach with a distinctly tropical flavour.
<i>PEACHES</i>	<i>DWARF STANDARDS</i>
Bonanza	Fruit white fleshed with red blush on skin. Freestone.
Garden Lady	Yellow skinned fruit with sweet, juicy yellow – red flesh. Freestone.
Honey Babe	Deep red skin with a hint of yellow. Sweet and firm. Freestone.
Pixzee	Well flavoured full sized yellow flesh peaches.
Rose Chiffon	White fleshed freestone peach with double deep coloured flowers.
<i>PEAR'S</i>	
Beurre Bosc	Dwarf – Mid season. Self-fertile but assisted by other Pears. Sweet dessert quality, large fruit with russet skin.
Conference	Dwarf – February. Self-fertile. Sweet and juicy. Green skin with some russeting.
Doyenne du Comice	Dwarf – February / March. Pollinate with William bon Chretien or Winter Nelis. Very sweet and juicy.
Packhams Triumph	Dwarf – Mid season. Pollinate with William bon Chretien. White sweet, crisp flesh.
Red Bartlett	Dwarf – Early ripening. Generally self-fertile. Dessert or bottling.
Seckel	Dwarf – Mid season. Self-fertile. Small very sweet pear.
Taylors Gold	Later ripening. Russeted Comice pear with sensational flavour.
William bon Chretien	Dwarf – February. Pollinate with Winter Nelis or Conference. Sweet. Smooth greenish- yellow skin.
Winter Cole	Dwarf – Mid season. Pollinate with WBC, or B Bosc or Packhams. Good dessert quality.
Winter Nelis	Dwarf – March. Pollinate with Conference or WBC. Good flavour and long keeping dessert quality.

<i>NASHI PEAR</i>	
Hosui	Mid-season. Partially self-fertile. Excellent eating, sweet, juicy with good acid balance and fine texture.
Nijiseiki	The fruit is very juicy, crisp and sweet with creamy white flesh and golden skin.
<i>PLUMS</i>	
Angelina Burdett	
Billington	Early season. Pollinators – Black Doris and Wilsons early. Good flavour with dark red skin and flesh.
Black Doris	February. Various pollinators including Santa Rosa. Dark skin, red flesh.
Coe’s Golden Drop	February. Pollinate with Damson or Greengage. Sweet tasting large fruit with yellow skin on flesh. Rich in flavour.
Damson	Late season. Self-fertile. Old favourite cooking plum but also good eating.
Duffs Early Jewel	December. Self-fertile. Medium to large dark red skin with yellow flesh.
Elephant Heart	Mid-season. Pollinator Omega or Sultan. Large red fruit. Upright and vigorous.
Greengage	February. Pollinator Coe’s Golden Drop or Angelina Burdett. Yellow flesh green skinned.
Hawera	January. Self-fertile. Delicious tasting dessert fruit. Bright red firm flesh.
Lucy	Mid to late season. Self-fertile. Sweet rich fruit.

Omega	March. Pollinators Elephant Heart or Sultan. Green and red speckled skin with red flesh. Sweet flavour.
Plum Prune Italian	Self-fertile. Dark purple skin with light amber flesh that turns red when cooked. Freestone with fine texture and flavour.
Plum Prune Stanley	Late season. Self-fertile. Dark blue skinned fruit with sweet and juicy golden flesh.
Plumcot Scarlet Sunrise	December / January. Red purple skin and yellow flesh. A cross of apricot and plum. Sweet and flavoursome.
Plumcot Spring Satin	Early season. A plum-apricot cross which combines the spritely plum flavour with the sweetness of apricot.
Reine Claud de Bavay	Late season. Self-fertile. European greengage. Richly flavoured fruit.
Santa Rosa	December / January. Self-fertile. Queen of all plums. Deep purple skin and yellow pinkish flesh. Firm and juicy.
Satsuma	February. Pollinator Santa Rosa. Red with a small freestone.
Shiro	Early season. Pollinator Santa Rosa. Large, golden week and juicy fruit.
<i>PINE NUTS</i>	
Pinus Pinea	Hardy fast growing evergreen specimen. Produces heavy crops of edible 'Pine Nuts'. Nuts ripen in autumn and fall to ground.
<i>quince</i>	
Smyrna	Mid April. Tender and sweet when cooked. Excellent quality.
Van Deman	Early ripening. The flesh is pale yellow with a good spicy flavour.
<i>RASPBERRIES</i>	

Ebony	December to February. Small firm rosette of dark black berries. Easily removed when ripe.
Heritage	Harvesting can extend from February until frosts start. Exceptionally firm quality fruit with good flavour.
Selwyn	December / January. Large sweet fruit. Fruit on 1 year wood. Feed with citrus food or similar.
Waimo Wonder	December / January. Large sweet fruit. Raspberries fruit on 2 nd year wood.
<i>Walnut's</i>	
Meyric	Grown from Seed – Good quality nuts maturing in 10-15 years.
Wilson's Wonder	Grafted – A vigorous trees which bears very young in life.
